GOALS

- This course seeks to
 - Equip the student with a biblical model for conscience.
 - Develop the student's ability to think critically about conscience.
 - Assist the student in thinking through the application of God's Word to our consciences.
 - Help students further develop their conceptual understanding of "Conscience" and how it relates to telling our stories.

OVERVIEW

 Development of a doctrine of conscience as a gift given by God that brings God's voice to bear in our lives and, subsequently, our stories.
